Joint Base San Antonio Fort Sam Houston

Fort Sam Houston was designated as a national historic landmark in 1975. As one of the Army's oldest installations and now part of Joint Base San Antonio, Fort Sam Houston boasts the largest collection of historic structures — more than 900 buildings. Even more consequential than the number is the historical integrity of the post's different sections which represent eras of construction. Careful preservation of these areas, along with two museums, allows the post to live with its history surrounded by the existence of the traditions of excellence established when the first soldier arrived here in 1845.

Joint Base San Antonio Randolph Air Force Base

Randolph is home to the 12th Flying Training Wing, the only unit in the Air Force conducting both pilot instructor training and combat systems officer training. In addition, the 12th FTW provides host-base support to more than 30 Department of Defense units, including HQ Air Education and Training Command, Air Force Personnel Center and Air Force Recruiting Service. The Wing's headquarters has been called the Taj Mahal due to its distinctive architecture and is listed on the U.S. National Register of Historic Places.

Brooks is a mixed-use development that was founded on the former Brooks Air Force Base when the United States Air Force closed the facility in 2002. Brooks features Hangar 9, built in 1918 and is the oldest wooden aircraft hangar of its kind still standing in its original location. On the cusp of its 100th birthday, Hangar 9 has long since retired its work housing "Jenny" aircrafts during World War I and now serves as a site for community events.
