Fiesta San Antonio!

Celebrating the diverse history and culture of San Antonio, Fiesta

started in 1891 as a tribute to the Alamo heroes. Today, more than 3.5 million people attend the 11-day celebration with more than 100 events. Activities include parades, carnivals, balls, art fairs, concerts and more. Most events are free and the Battle of Flowers Parade is one of the biggest in the nation, second only to the Rose Bowl's Tournament of Roses Parade. The Texas Cavaliers River Parade, one of the only night parades in the nation, attracts tourists and locals alike as they fill the banks of the San Antonio river to watch the decorated floats.

Luminaria's core events emanate from downtown and surround visitors with simultaneous and innovative programming: storefront exhibitions; art lighting; alley galleries and numerous stages with theater, dance and musical performances.
