



How to Prepare Your Home for Buyers

Clean your home

Cleanliness signals to a buyer that the home has been well cared for and is most likely in good repair. A messy or dirty home may deter prospective buyers from making an offer.

Remove the clutter

Before you list your home, empty closets and drawers, have a garage sale and donate what you can't sell. The less "stuff" visible in and around a house, the roomier it will seem.

Let the light in

Raise the shades. Open the blinds. Pull back the curtains. Put brighter bulbs in all the lamps (but not bright enough to cause a glare). Bright, open rooms feel larger and more inviting. Dark rooms appear small and gloomy.

Freshen up your space

Get rid of odors that may be unfamiliar or unpleasant. People are most often offended by odors from tobacco, pets, cooking and musty or sour laundry. Fresh flowers and potpourri can be used to your advantage. Other smells that attract positive attention include fresh baked bread, vanilla and cinnamon.

Repair broken items

This includes plumbing, electrical systems and switches, windows, squeaky floorboards, TV antennas, screens, doors and fences. If it can't be fixed, replace it or get rid of it. A buyer might make a much lower offer if your house is in disrepair, or they may insist that everything be fixed before taking occupancy.

Secure pets

If possible, it's wise to move pets away from the house when prospective buyers are coming. Unfamiliar visitors might be fearful of or allergic to a pet. And your cat or dog might be frightened by newcomers and even try to escape.

Make good use of scheduled viewings

Serious buyers may want to spend a fair amount of time looking at your home, so be sure to find suitable all-ages activities to occupy your household during showings.

Paint

A fresh coat of neutral paint can be a gamechanger for a property, potentially making it appear more valuable.

Noise

Silence is a soothing sound that offends no one. Turn off the TV and radio. Soft instrumental music is fine, but avoid vocals.

Remember:

A clean, neat, quiet and uncluttered home will show well.

Homestead Exemptions: What You Should Know

Homestead, defined

A homestead can be a separate structure, condominium or a manufactured home located on owned or leased land, as long as the individual living in the home owns it. A homestead can include up to 20 acres if the land is owned by the homeowner and used as a yard or for another purpose related to the residential use of the homestead.

Requirements

Homestead exemptions remove part of your home's value from taxation. If you want to receive a homestead exemption for the taxes on your home, the property must first qualify as a residence homestead on January 1 of the year in which you are applying. There are two requirements:

- 1. You must own your home on January 1. (If you are over 65 and/or disabled, the January 1 ownership and residency are not required.)
- 2. You must use the home as your principal residence on January 1.

What homestead exemptions are available?

School taxes: All residence homestead owners are allowed a \$40,000 residence homestead exemption from their home's value for school taxes.

County taxes: If a county collects a special tax for farm-to-market roads or flood control, a residence homestead owner may receive a \$3,000 exemption for this tax. If the county grants an optional exemption for homeowners age 65 or older or disabled, the owners will receive only the local-option exemption.

Age 65 or older and disabled exemptions: Individuals 65 and older and/or disabled residence homestead owners may qualify for a \$10,000 homestead exemption for school taxes, in addition to the \$15,000 exemption for all homeowners. If the owner qualifies for both the \$10,000 exemption for 65 and older homeowners and the \$10,000 exemption for disabled homeowners, the owner must choose one or the other for school taxes. The owner cannot receive both exemptions.

Optional 65 or older or disabled exemptions: Any taxing unit may offer an additional exemption amount of at least \$3,000 for taxpayers age 65 or older and/or disabled.

Optional percentage exemptions: Any taxing unit — including a city, county, school or special district — may offer an exemption of up to 20% of a home's value. But no matter what the percentage is, the amount of an optional exemption cannot be less than \$5,000. Each taxing unit decides if it will offer the exemption and at what percentage. This percentage exemption is added to any other home exemption for which an owner qualifies. The taxing unit must decide before July 1 of the tax year to offer this exemption.

Do I, as a homeowner, get a tax break from property taxes?

You may apply for homestead exemptions on your principal residence. Homestead exemptions remove part of your home's value from taxation, so they lower your taxes. For example, if your home is appraised at \$300,000 and you qualify for a \$40,000 exemption (this is the amount mandated for school districts), you will pay school taxes on the home as if it was worth only \$260,000. Taxing units have the option to offer a separate exemption of up to 20% of the total value.

Do all homes qualify for homestead exemptions?

No, only a homeowner's principal residence qualifies. To qualify, a home must meet the definition of a residence homestead: The home's owner must be an individual (for example: not a corporation or other business entity) and use the home as his or her principal residence on January 1 of the tax year. An age 65 or older or disabled exemption is effective as of January 1 of the tax year the applicant qualifies for the homestead and applies to the entire tax year.

What documentation do I need to provide in order to obtain a homestead exemption?

A state law that took effect on September 1, 2011 has changed proof of residency requirements for homeowners applying for the property tax homestead exemption. It's vital that buyers update their address on their driver licenses and with the tax assessor/collector in their area.

- 1. Application for residential homestead exemption (available on the websites of most county appraisal districts).
- 2. Copy of driver licenses or identification card from the Texas Department of Public Safety at *dps.texas.gov*.
- 3. If you do not own a vehicle, you must complete the non-ownership of motor vehicle affidavit (found on the application for residential homestead exemption), sign it before a notary public and attach a copy of a utility bill showing the homestead address.
- 4. The homestead exemption will not be allowed unless all the required documents show the same homestead address. All three documents must have the same address.

It's vital that home buyers update their address on their driver licenses.

MOVER'S CHECKLIST



ONE MONTH BEFORE THE MOVE

- ☐ Make arrangements to hire a mover or rent a truck.
- □ Make babysitting and/or pet care arrangements for moving day.
- \Box File a change of address form at the post office.
- Update all newspaper and magazine subscriptions.
- Arrange for the transfer of all medical, dental and school records.
- Transfer medical, property, fire and auto insurance.
- Organize all move-related documents in one place, such as a folder or binder.

TWO WEEKS BEFORE THE MOVE

- Cancel or transfer all utilities (water, gas, electric, telephone, cable/internet service).
- Check with your provider about cell phone service in your new location.
- □ Transfer prescriptions to a pharmacy near your new location.
- Transfer bank accounts.
- Collect or purchase packing supplies (e.g., boxes, wrapping paper, bubble wrap, labels, markers, box cutters or scissors and packing tape).
- \Box Pack up items in garage, attic and storage areas.
- □ Confirm arrangements with movers or truck rental.

ONE WEEK BEFORE THE MOVE

- □ Begin packing and labeling boxes.
- Empty, defrost and clean refrigerator, freezer and stove.
- □ Pick up anything outstanding, such as dry cleaning, prescriptions, etc.

THE DAY BEFORE THE MOVE

- \Box Do a final check of closets, cabinets and drawers.
- \Box Make sure you have enough cash on hand for the move.
- Take out all trash.
- Fully charge all cell phones.
- Touch base with movers or truck rental for a final confirmation of arrangements.

THE DAY OF THE MOVE

- Exchange contact information with the movers in case you need to get in touch with them while en route. Include your old/new address, cell phone number and directions to new location.
- □ Keep jewelry and other valuables with you, in a box that you move yourself.
- □ Prepare a box of supplies that you will need right away on move-in day, such as: cleaning supplies, snacks and beverages, toiletries, bath and bedding items, trash bags, disposable dishes, pet food, cell phone chargers, prescriptions, eyeglasses, changes of clothing, etc.
- Do a final check before locking the doors. Confirm that you have turned off the furnace/air conditioner, lawn sprinklers and light switches.
- □ Hand off keys and garage door opener(s) to your landlord or real estate agent.

CLOSING COST DEFINITIONS



Appraisal Fee

Cost for a professional evaluation of the property's market value based on comparable sales, improvements on the property and location. (Fee usually set by the Appraiser.)

Assumption Transfer Fee

A fee charged to the buyer and assessed by the lender for the buyer to assume the present loan.

Credit Report

A report of your credit history.

Discount Points

Points lenders may charge to increase the investor's yield. May be paid by either buyer or seller. The number of discount points depends on the rate quoted and the current market rates.

Escrow Fee

The title company's service fee for acting as an escrow agent, carrying out contract instructions, obtaining execution and recording of necessary documents; and disbursing sale proceeds; usually split between buyer and seller.

Filing Fees/Recording Fees

Fees for recording documents in the appropriate county; and determined by the number of pages per document.

Hazard Insurance

Fire and extended coverage casualty insurance protects property and contents in case of loss; required by the lender for at least the loan amount.

Inspections

An examination of the property for various reasons such as termite inspections, mechanical inspections, and roof inspections; parties may also require follow-up inspections after required repairs are completed.

Interest or Per Diem

Interest due on the seller's existing mortgage through the date of pay-off received. Interest is usually paid in arrears. Interest also includes prepaid interest on the buyer's loan for the remainder of the month in which closing occurs.

Loan Application Fee

Fee paid to the lender at the time of application; check with your lender.

Miscellaneous Lender Fees

May include fees for underwriting, processing, tax services fee, warehousing, etc.; varies with each lender. Check your lender's GFE (Good Faith Estimate) for disclosure and explanation.

Mortgagee's Policy

A policy insuring lender of validity and priority of its lien.

Origination Fee

The Lender may charge the purchaser a fee to originate a new loan.

Owners Title Policy

A policy that indemnifies the buyer against losses for covered defects in title. (Premium is set by the State Board of Insurance.)

Prepayment Penalty

A fee charged for early payoff of the seller's existing mortgage loan. If the penalty applies, it will be stated in the existing mortgage instruments of record.

PMI Premium/MIP Premium

Insures the lender against loss in the event of default by the borrower. (PMI-private mortgage insurance — conventional loans; MIP-mortgage insurance protection — FHA loans)

Prorated Taxes

Taxes are prorated with the seller paying taxes from January 1st through the closing date and the buyer paying the remainder. Figures are usually based on actual taxes charged from the previous year. Any shortages or overages due at the end of the existing year are between the buyer and seller.

Realtor Fee

An amount paid to the brokerage firm representing the consumer (buyer or seller) for real estate services agreed upon in the property listing agreement or buyer representation agreement.

Restrictions

Recorded documents that restrict and limit the use of the defined property.

Survey


A statement (drawing) showing the corners, distances and directions of the boundaries of a tract of land along with easements, encroachments, etc. as may be required in the contract.

Tax Search Certificates

Certificates obtained to determine any unpaid property taxes or assessments that may constitute liens against the property.

San Antonio: Warm and Welcoming

San Antonio has a transitional humid subtropical climate featuring very hot, long and humid summers with mild to cool winters. The area is subject to descending northern cold fronts in the winter with cool to cold nights, however, it can be warm and rainy in the spring and fall.

Temperature

The hot season lasts for 3.7 months, from May 30 to September 19, with an average daily high temperature above 89°F. The hottest day of the year is August 6, with an average high of 96°F and low of 76°F.

The cool season lasts for 2.8 months, from November 27 to February 20, with an average daily high temperature below 70°F. The coldest day of the year is January 6, with an average low of 43°F and high of 63°F.

Humidity


We base the humidity comfort level on the dew point, as it determines whether perspiration will evaporate from the skin, thereby cooling the body. Lower dew points feel drier and higher dew points feel more humid. Unlike temperature, which typically varies significantly between night and day, dew point tends to change more slowly, so while the temperature may drop at night, a muggy day is typically followed by a muggy night.


San Antonio experiences extreme seasonal variation in the perceived humidity.

The muggier period of the year lasts for 6.7 months, from April 9 to October 31, during which time the comfort level is muggy, oppressive, or miserable at least 24% of the time. The muggiest day of the year is July 1, with muggy conditions 89% of the time. The least muggy day of the year is January 23, with muggy conditions 2% of the time.



San Antonio's **Legendary Attractions**

With more than three centuries of attractions, there is something here for everyone!



For many, San Antonio is the Paseo del Rio, an urban masterpiece better known as the **River Walk**. These cobblestone and flagstone paths border the San Antonio River, as it winds through culture-rich downtown. The River Walk has multiple personalities — quiet and park-like in some stretches, while other areas are full of activity with European-style sidewalk cafes, specialty boutiques,

art galleries, nightclubs and gleaming high-rise hotels. Thanks to the Mission Reach project, the River Walk now links Brackenridge Park on the north end with Mission Espada to the south. Rio San Antonio Cruises, the river's floating transportation system, provides a novel method of sightseeing and people watching in downtown San Antonio. Groups can dine aboard open-air cruisers as they drift along the scenic waterway, while river taxis deliver visitors to restaurants, hotels, the Henry B. Gonzalez Convention Center and The Shops at Rivercenter — a dazzling three-level, glass shopping, dining and entertainment complex.



Explore Spanish colonial architecture at San Antonio's five 18th-century missions. Of course, The Alamo is etched in the annals of history. In 1836, 189 defenders of Texas independence held The Alamo against some 4,000 Mexican troops for 13 days. Four

other Spanish colonial missions founded in the early 1700s form San Antonio Missions National Historical Park — a marvelous place to explore the city's roots and Spain's influence on the southwestern United States. In 2015, all of the historic

missions earned UNESCO's World Heritage site designation. The visitor center at Mission San José is the perfect starting point for exploring what the missions have to offer. Drive from mission to mission or take Mission Trail, ideal for hiking and biking.



A tour of downtown San Antonio opens the door to centuries of history. Developed in the 18th century, La Villita Historic Arts Village ("the little village") was one of San Antonio's original settlements. It became a hub of Texas revolutionary activities

in 1835 and 1836. Today, La Villita is a haven for artists and craftsmen. Collectibles such as blown glass, jewelry, handcrafts and fashions reflect Mexican and Central American influences.

When the city was the capital of the Spanish Province of Texas, the **Spanish Governor's Palace** was the seat of government. This historic structure is open to the public and resides downtown near City Hall and **San Fernando Cathedral**. Canary Islanders began construction on San Fernando Cathedral in 1731, making it the nation's oldest cathedral sanctuary.




Dating to 1840, Market Square (El Mercado), the largest Mexican marketplace north of the Rio Grande, is a festive celebration of Tex-Mex cuisine, music, entertainment and

products ranging from pearls to piñatas. It anchors **Centro de Artes** — an exhibit that tells the story of Latinos in America.

Just south of downtown's Market Square, the **King William** Historic District reflects San Antonio's German heritage in a gracious residential area settled in the late 1800s. These beautiful mansions comprise one of San Antonio's most elite neighborhoods. Among them, the Steves Homestead mansion and Villa Finale are open to the public, transporting guests to a time of architectural indulgence.

San Antonio is the picture-perfect setting for great family vacations. Enjoy Texas-sized fun at **SeaWorld San Antonio**, one of the world's largest marine life parks. SeaWorld San Antonio

combines fun with education and appreciation for some of the ocean's most fascinating creatures through shows, educational exhibits and rides. Explore **Aquatica**, a water park designed as a South Seas oasis with all the amenities of a beachside resort, including terraced pools, a giant wave pool, meandering crystal-blue rivers, sandy beaches and private cabanas. Aquatica boasts unique attractions

such as up-close stingray encounters and a "weightless" family raft ride that's a first for North America.

Just down the road, **Six Flags Fiesta Texas** is a non-stop celebration of San Antonio and South Texas. It's designed around four themed areas: The Mexican town of Los Festivales; the German village of Spassburg; the 1920s' cowboy boomtown of Crackaxle Canyon; and the small Texas town of Rockville which includes a '50s-'60s seaside boardwalk. Themes are carried out by entertaining musical shows, and exciting rides including water rides and massive steel roller coasters.

Designed specifically for individuals with special needs, **Morgan's Wonderland** is the world's first, non-profit and ultra-accessible family fun park. It is completely wheelchair-accessible, and features more than 25 elements and attractions including rides, playgrounds, gardens, an eight-acre fishing lake, 18,000-square-foot special-events center, 575-seat amphitheater and picnic and rest areas throughout the park. The park also features Inspiration Island, the world's only ultra-accessible water park.

Families may want to start their exploration of the city at **The DoSeum**, where kids are encouraged to explore a miniature version of a city evocative of San Antonio with attractions like a veterinarian office, a Whataburger and an H-E-B. Kids of all ages will want to experience the excitement of **The Magik Children's Theatre**, a professional theater in the heart of downtown, and the nearby **Yanaguana Garden** at HemisFair Park. Another favorite is the **Tower of the Americas**, which offers a spectacular view of San Antonio from 750 feet above the ground. Just blocks away, Louis Tussaud's Plaza Wax Museum houses more than 225 life-like characters in four themed sections — Hollywood, Horrors, History and Religion. Next door, the world's largest **Ripley's Believe It or** Not! Odditorium is located in San Antonio's historic Alamo Plaza, right across from The Alamo and next to the famed River Walk. Proving that truth can be stranger than fiction, Ripley's is known for providing exhibits that showcase the ultimate in odd and bizarre like a two-trunked elephant, a 512-pound iron meteorite and locks of Marilyn Monroe's hair, among other oddities. The **Guinness World Records Museum** is a state-of-the-art, interactive experience that brings the world-famous book to life. Another popular stop is the **Buckhorn Saloon & Museum** which showcases an over 124-year-old bar, one-of-a-kind oddities, Western memorabilia, and offers visitors a journey back to the Old West through exhibits, an old-fashioned arcade, the saloon and a shooting gallery.

Brackenridge Park, a 343-acre refuge in the heart of the city, provides a full day of family fun. Play a round of golf at Texas' most historic course. Feed ducks and picnic along the adjacent San Antonio River. Refresh with a stroll on the walking trails or catch a ride on the park's miniature train, the Brackenridge Eagle. Here you'll also find the **San Antonio Zoo**, with a collection of more than 3,500 animals representing 750 different species from around the globe. It is also the only zoo in the country to exhibit endangered whooping cranes.

Nearby, the **Witte Museum** and its H-E-B Lantern | Valero Great Hall | Gates/Elliot Families Orientation Theater offers hands-on learning, with exhibits exploring history, science and anthropology. The Witte recently underwent a significant \$100 million expansion that features new exhibits, classrooms, and laboratories.

Not far from Brackenridge Park, you can follow your senses through the **San Antonio Botanical Garden**, where acres of beautiful, lush vegetation replicate three distinct landscapes of Texas. Wander through formal gardens and even a sensory garden, where emphasis is placed on the texture and scent of plants. With an addition of eight acres in October 2017, the Botanical Garden now offers new culinary opportunities through

the Culinary Garden and the Family Adventure Garden, where landscapes of South Texas and the Hill Country abound.

Area rivers provide opportunities for boating, canoeing and tubing. Area lakes attract fishing enthusiasts, as well as water skiing and sailing fans. Nearby dude ranches deliver a taste of the Old West, complete with horseback riding. Numerous state parks provide picturesque terrain for hiking.

Visitors to San Antonio also have a variety of spectator sports to choose from. The NBA's **San Antonio Spurs** are a hometown favorite and play at the Frost Bank Center. The NCAA's **UTSA Roadrunners** bring fans to the Alamodome during college football season since their first game in 2011. The San Antonio Brahmas of the United Football League provide some of the coolest action in town while the **Missions** baseball team encourages everyone to get out and enjoy the beautiful Texas weather. Plus, live action-packed thoroughbred and quarter horse racing seasons are presented at **Retama Park** from May through November.







San Antonio also has many museums to fill the day,

including ones that are totally kid-centric. Little ones can roam through a miniature model of a city and play with sound and light in the Sensations Studio at **The DoSeum** — an interactive learning center where kids play to learn and parents learn to play. The nearby Witte Museum features scientific and historic exhibits like mummies and a dinosaur gallery. The Smithsonian-affiliated museum underwent a transformation to expand on popular archaeological attractions, add outdoor features, and provide new facilities for learning opportunities for children and adults alike. Discover the Witte's various new additions, including laboratories, galleries and classrooms. Here, children can try out the hands-on exhibits and see how science is used in the "real world."

Families enjoy nationally acclaimed museums including Centro de Artes which proudly displays collections, exhibitions and educational programming dedicated to Latino culture. The **UTSA Institute of Texan Cultures** is another of the city's Smithsonian affiliates. It tells the stories of the people and cultures that built Texas. Other notable museums include the McNay Art Museum, which has a grand collection of French Impressionist pieces and the San Antonio Museum of Art, which offers the Nelson A. Rockefeller Center for Latin American Art — the largest repository of its kind.





The crown jewel is the opulent Majestic Theatre,

built downtown in 1929, is a memorable setting for touring Broadway shows, concerts and popular comedians. The neighboring **Charline McCombs Empire Theatre** reflects the beaux-arts grandeur of the 1920s and hosts touring musical acts and other entertainment headliners. The art deco **Alameda Theater**, currently under renovation as part of the Centro Alameda affiliation program with the Kennedy Center, will reclaim its status as the centerpiece of Latino arts, culture, and entertainment in downtown San Antonio. The **Aztec Theatre** is a beautifully restored Meso-American themed masterpiece built in 1926. Today, the facility provides a venue for multi-purpose entertainment and events for the city at large. Throughout the year, LiveNation manages scheduling for the theatre, providing entertainment ranging from private parties to live concerts.



Joint Base San Antonio Fort Sam Houston

Fort Sam Houston was designated as a national historic landmark in 1975. As one of the Army's oldest installations and now part of Joint Base San Antonio, Fort Sam Houston boasts the largest collection of historic structures—more than 900 buildings. Even more consequential than the number is the historical integrity of the post's different sections which represent eras of construction. Careful preservation of these areas, along with two museums, allows the post to live with its history surrounded by the existence of the traditions of excellence established when the first soldier arrived here in 1845.
